

FELINE Urinary Tract Disease

Feline lower urinary tract disease encompasses various bladder and urethra conditions in cats. It is usually seen in middle-aged, overweight cats, but can still be a problem for any feline.

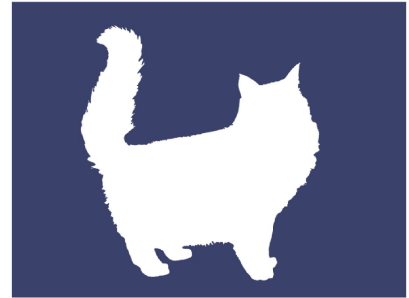
SYMPTOMS

- Blood in the urine
- Excessive licking of genital area
- Urinating outside the litter box
- Frequent trips to the litter box
- Crying out while urinating



CAUSES

- **Urinary Stones (Urolithiasis)**
Collection of minerals that form in the urinary tract of cats.
- **Urethral Obstruction**
A potentially life-threatening condition where a cat's urethra becomes partly or totally blocked
- **Feline Idiopathic Cystitis**
Inflammation of the bladder



HOW TO PREVENT

- Provide clean, fresh water at all times
- Feed small meals frequently
- Minimize any major changes in routine
- Reduce stress
- Provide a quiet, safe place for the litter box
