He had several medical issues including arthritis and was put on medications for each of those conditions. Because many adopters do not wish to take on these challenges, Dr. Pepper stayed in his room waiting for the right person to come along. Volunteers visited him regularly and gave him lots of love, but what he really needed was a quiet home where he would get lots of attention and would be the king of the house. Recently, Pauline and Dane came along, and they fell in love immediately. Here is their story:

"In December of 2024, we lost our ginger boy of over 11 years. Christmas was not the same, so in January we decided to go to Forgotten Felines and rescue another cat. We were not looking for a kitten, but what we wanted was one that was overlooked because of color, age, or medical issues.



There were many to choose from and they each had their own story to tell. However, when we went into Dr. Pepper's room, he jumped right down to greet us as if we were long lost friends. He started purring immediately while we petted him and kept staring at us with his big golden eyes. We knew right away he wanted us to give him a warm home filled with a lot of love.

Fast Facts about our TNR (Trap, Neuter, Release) Program

- The mission of Forgotten Felines and Fidos is to reduce the number of homeless, unwanted cats by offering a low-cost spay/neuter program and by working together with the community to help control the feline population.
- The TNR (Trap, Neuter, Release) program helps the community by stabilizing the population of feral colonies and over time reducing it. Adult feral or stray cats can be trapped, neutered by a veterinarian, and returned into the same area, but only under strict guidelines. Cats that are neutered and returned to a familiar area are healthier and will not be adding to the pet overpopulation by having unwanted litters.
- Some municipalities recognize the benefit of TNR to their communities and have set up financial assistance programs.
- Our TNR price is \$50 which includes spay or neuter, rabies and distemper shots. The price also includes flea/tick/ear mite treatments. All TNR cats must come in traps to be charged the TNR price.
- Appointments are made as space permits by calling (610)-760-9009. Payment is due at the time of checkin, and only cash or checks are accepted.
- Feral cats will often not come close enough to be picked up and placed in a standard carrier, so a humane trap is used for this purpose. If you do not have a trap, you can obtain one, with a refundable deposit of \$50 by contacting us. We will be happy to provide instructions on the best way to trap.
- We help the cat in any way possible. This includes tending to wounds, removing a polyp or taking care of
 entropion issues (this is when a cat's eyelashes have been rubbing on the cat's eyes and is quite painful).
- The cat receives a 1cm ear tip on their left ear to symbolize that they were spayed or neutered. We call it the badge of honor.
- Once the cat has been cleared after surgery, the owner picks them up and is given the care instructions
 along with their rabies tag. Male cats can usually be released once back to colony unless other treatment
 was performed. Females are highly recommended to be held for 48 hours since the surgery includes
 stitches.

TNR saves so many lives, so if you're feeding outdoor cats, make sure you get them spayed and neutered!


